

Facilities

What	Y/N	Notes	Image
Blue Badge Parking	Yes	<p>We have allocated an additional 10 temporary blue badge parking spaces that are located approx. 75 metres from the fort entrance. Follow event signage.</p> <p>In the Nothe Fort Gardens Car Park, there are also 4 large bay disabled spaces approx. 150 metres from the fort entrance.</p>	
Wheelchair access	Yes	<p>Gravel surface over hardstanding floor across main courtyard of the Fort, however hard standing floored pathways entering and around the perimeter of venue, with ramp access 1.1m width with hand rails across the site.</p> <p>Rampart area hard standing floor and accessible via lift.</p>	
Additional Parking	Yes	<p>The Nothe Fort Gardens Car Park operates a pay and display ticketing system. No Height Restriction.</p> <p>Prices (correct at time of print) as follows: 1 hour £1, 2 hours £2, 3 hours £3.50, 4 hours £4.50, 6 hours £6, All day £8. FREE after 6pm.</p>	

Drop-Off point	Yes	A drop off zone will be available, allowing drivers to drop off anyone who has access requirements. This will be located approx. 100 metres from the fort entrance. The walk from here is on hard standing ground, with slight downward gradient and uneven in places.		
Accessible Toilets	Yes	Accessible toilets are available on site and in the Blue Badge car parking area. Nothe Fort toilets are fully accessible with a wide entrance, emergency cord and alarm system, hand rails and baby changing facilities.		
Changing Places Toilet	Yes	<p>The Nearest changing places toilet is located on Weymouth seafront. THIS FACILITY DOES NOT USE A RADAR KEY</p> <p>How to gain access: The toilet is located on the ground floor of the Beach Rescue Centre directly off the Esplanade on Weymouth seafront.</p> <p>Access is via a swipe fob entry system. If you do not have a fob, a temporary fob can be borrowed. Please go to Weymouth Library, Great George Street, Weymouth, DT4 8NN. Library opening hours Mon 10:00 to 19:00, Tues 09:30 to 17:30, Weds</p>		

		<p>09:30 to 13:00, Thurs 09:30 to 19:00, Fri 09:30 to 17:30, Sat 09:00 to 16:00, Sun closed. The library has five fobs to loan out. You will need to give a £10 deposit which you will get back when you return the fob, you will also be asked to leave your name and contact telephone number.</p> <p>Facilities; Bench (Height Adjustable, Adult Sized, Free Standing) Hoist (Ceiling, Loop) Peninsular Toilet, Non Slip Floor, Floor space 12 sq.m.</p>	<p>Weymouth Beach Control Office: The Kings Statue, The Esplanade, Weymouth, DT4 7AN</p>
Seating	Yes	<p>Outdoor benches available on hard standing surfaces and picnic table located on gravel surfaces. Should you need to bring a fold-out seat with you, you are welcome to do so.</p>	

Viewing Areas	<p>Yes</p> <p>There is stair or ramp access (steep incline) or a lift on site to access the fort ramparts. There will be a front of house desk and volunteer stewards on hand should you require any assistance with reaching these points.</p> <p>This is specifically for audience members wishing to attend 'A Small Dream' performance on Friday 14th July, 9.30pm as audience will need to view from the Rampart area.</p> <p>Notes for Mobility Scooter users for lift: Dimensions: Door opening width 850mm Car depth 1100mm Inside width to handrail (widest point) 1500mm Weight capacity 630KG Please note C3 Mobility Scooters will not fit in the lift.</p>	
Food/Drink	<p>Yes</p> <p>Front View Café is located inside the Fort will be open 10:30am-5:30pm daily. Café is spacious with wide entrances with hard flooring, movable tables and chairs, and an open counter space for service.</p> <p>If wish to make a booking or require any additional information from Front View Café contact Catering Manager Jill Homer Tel 07921 003872.</p> <p>Dorset Seafood Festival is taking place on the same weekend in Weymouth centre with a range of food and drink stalls on offer.</p> <p>Weymouth town centre and seafront also offers a range of restaurants/bars/cafes under 1 mile distance from Nothe Fort.</p>

Grading Key

The following coding system has been used where possible, detailed descriptions on each site are also included. The information included in this guide is to help audience members decide which routes they want to take as they move around the event site. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to ask a member of Activate at the festival information points or **Contact Us** via details on page 9.

GREEN: Gentle to moderate gradients with reasonably level surfaces. Path surfaces include tarmac, short grass and firm compacted gravel. No narrow gaps, steps or other access restrictions. Suitable for some wheelchair users and mobility scooters but assistance may be required on some slopes and surfaces.

ORANGE: Moderate gradients with uneven surfaces. Long grass and uneven surfaced paths with loose gravel, and larger sized stones. No narrow gaps, steps or other access restrictions. Suitable for some all-terrain mobility scooters.

RED: Steep gradients or paths with narrow, uneven surfaces. Long grass, un-surfaced paths with larger diameter loose gravel, bare earth, exposed tree roots and large stones. Narrow gaps including bridges, steps and other access restrictions.
